Training Objectives

To increase knowledge of health and education professionals on the unique needs of Gay, Lesbian, Bisexual, Transgender and Questioning (GLBTQ) youth.

To increase knowledge of substance abuse prevention and its application to GLBTQ youth as an “at risk” population.
